· vou are entered in the population register or aliens register of a Brussels municipality no later than 1 August 2024 and

CITIZENS FROM OUTSIDE THE UNION (NON-EU)

You can vote in local elections if:



 you are aged 18 or over on 13 October 2024 and



 you are entered in the population register or aliens register of a Brussels municipality no later than 1 August 2024 and



vou are still entitled to vote on 13 October 2024 (you may lose your voting rights temporarily or permanently as a result of a court decision) and



 you have been living officially in Belgium, on the basis of a legal residence permit, continuously for 5 years prior to your application for registration, i.e. since 31 July 2019 at the latest and



 vou make a declaration in which you undertake to respect the Constitution, the laws of the Belgian people and the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms. This declaration is part of the online and paper registration form.

you have been living officially in Belgium, on the basis of a legal residence permit, continuously for 5 years prior to your application for registration, i.e. since 31 July 2019 at the latest and



vou make a declaration in which you undertake to respect the Constitution, the laws of the Belgian people and the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms. This declaration is part of the online and paper registration form.
